2024-2025 Undergraduate Research Fellowship

APPLICATION DEADLINE: FRIDAY, MARCH 29, 2024

The Center for Mind, Brain, and Culture invites undergraduates to apply for our interdisciplinary research fellowship. This fellowship provides undergraduate researchers with intellectual and professional development opportunities through participation in the vibrant, interdisciplinary intellectual community of the Center.

Students awarded the CMBC undergraduate fellowship will:

- Participate in regular networking lunches
- Interact with CMBC graduate certificate students and core faculty
- Enjoy special access to CMBC events and visiting scholars
- Be eligible to request up to \$500 in funding for interdisciplinary research and/or conference participation

Students apply in the spring of their junior year for **award in the senior year**. The fellowship is yearlong, beginning at the start of the fall semester and running through the last day of spring classes. **Priority will be given to students conducting research** (literature or data based; e.g. honors projects, research partners, and independent studies) in an area relevant to mind, brain, or culture.

Eligibility

- Eligible applicants include all Emory undergraduate students
- Applicants must be in their junior year seeking senior year fellowship support

Proposals should include:

- Cover letter explaining your motivations, objectives, and qualifications in applying for the fellowship, including any current or planned interdisciplinary research activities (**500 word limit**)
- CV or resume
- A copy of your unofficial Emory transcript
- Name and contact information from an academic reference (e.g., thesis advisor, research supervisor, etc.)

Notification is expected by Wednesday, MAY 1, 2024.
